



OMA reports a 46.7% decrease in October 2020 passenger traffic

Mexico City, Mexico, November 4, 2020—Mexican airport operator Grupo Aeroportuario del Centro Norte, S.A.B. de C.V., known as OMA (NASDAQ: OMAB; BMV: OMA), reports that terminal passenger traffic at its 13 airports decreased 46.7% in October 2020, as compared to October 2019. Domestic traffic decreased 45.2%, and international traffic decreased 59.8%.
