OMA reports an 8.3% increase in October 2019 passenger traffic

- The Monterrey (+4.4%), Acapulco (+41.3%), and Ciudad Juárez (+16.8%) airports contributed most to traffic growth

Monterrey, Mexico, November 6, 2019—Mexican airport operator Grupo Aeroportuario del Centro Norte, S.A.B. de C.V., known as OMA (NASDAQ: OMAB; BMV: OMA), reports that terminal passenger traffic at its 13 airports increased 8.3% in October 2019, as compared to October 2018. Domestic traffic increased 8.2%, and international traffic increased 9.6%.

During October 2019, **domestic traffic** increased in **twelve** of our airports, with the largest increases in:

- **Monterrey** (+4.2%) as a result of increased traffic on the Cancún, Tijuana and Bajío routes.
- **Acapulco** (+41.0%) benefitted from increased traffic on the Mexico City route.
- **Ciudad Juárez** (+16.6%), due to increased traffic on the Mexico City and Bajío routes, and
- **Mazatlán** (+25.3%) due to increased traffic on the Tijuana and Mexico City routes.

International traffic grew in **ten** of our airports in October, with the largest increases in Monterrey (+6.7%), as a result of increases in the number of passengers on the Las Vegas and Houston routes; and Durango (+80.6%), due to increased traffic on the Dallas route.

Of total passenger traffic, 99.3% was commercial, and 0.7% was general aviation.
