OMA reports a 3.0% decrease in March 2021 passenger traffic

Mexico City, Mexico, April 5, 2021—Mexican airport operator Grupo Aeroportuario del Centro Norte, S.A.B. de C.V., known as OMA (NASDAQ: OMAB; BMV: OMA), reports that terminal passenger traffic at its 13 airports decreased 3.0% in March 2021, as compared to March 2020. Domestic traffic decreased 2.3%, and international traffic decreased 8.5%.
